Roducer Barton & Guestier is a wine business with an almost three-century-long history, founded by the Irishman Thomas Barton in 1725 when he settled in the city of Bordeaux. In 1802, his grandson partnered with the Frenchman Daniel Guestier, and the business flourished for a long time, shipping Bordeaux wine on ships to Ireland, England, the Netherlands, and the USA. The esteemed company faced its biggest challenges due to the devastation caused by phylloxera and the two World Wars. While no longer family-owned, the traditions persist with dedicated professionals delivering French wines to 130 different countries, widely available even at international airports. Barton & Guestier's range showcases an impressive array of France's important wine regions: Bordeaux, the Loire Valley, Burgundy, Beaujolais, the Rhône Valley, Languedoc, Gascony, and Corsica. The company collaborates with around 200 winegrowers in these areas. Barton & Guestier focuses on offering high-quality, typically French wines to the world while considering the requirements of sustainable development.
