Story Dig This! Shiraz/Merlot is an organic wine, ethically produced and Fair for Life certified. No animal-derived substances are used in the preparation of the wine, so it also suits vegans. Part of the product price goes to Stellar Foundation, that supports the local community, for example, by providing health care to employees. In addition, an equal share of the price goes to Greenpop, planting trees in South Africa and Zambia. Label shovel just refers to planting trees, but Dig plays with the synonyms of digging and liking.

Producer Stellar Winery is the largest producer of high-quality, fair trade, organic wines in South Africa. The company sources certified grapes from independent growers in the Western Cape region. Some of the growers and workers own a portion of the company, which operates with a focus on caring for the environment, workers, farmers, and their families, carrying social responsibility for the entire area. Stellar is the world's largest producer of wine without added sulfites. In addition to organic production, Stellar aims to be a pioneer in both winemaking and social development. The Running Duck wine series from Stellar Winery derives its name from the Indian runner ducks. These swift, flat-footed ducks feed on snails and other pests in the vineyards, taking care of the well-being of the organic wine vines.

COLOR Deep dark red

AROMA Blackcurrant on the nose, dark plums, pomegranate and spices

TASTE Medium-bodied, soft, dark notes of berry, herbal and spicy. A well-balanced wine gets vibrancy from a fine acid structure

TIPS FOR USE A multi-purpose all-round wine for a variety of meat dishes, for savoury snacks, for grilled fish, for fries and cheeses. It is also well suited as a social wine.
